

Fourth Grade Homework Policy

Daily written homework:

- Students will earn a consequence point on the Incentive Sheet for incomplete homework.
- This type of homework is generally used in class on the due date to give the teacher timely feedback on the students' needs. Students usually hear the answers in class, that same day, as it is graded.

RAH (Read at Home):

- Students will a consequence point on the Friday Incentive Sheet for each day late.
- Accepted one day late without a lowered grade, but student will receive a zero on the Friday Incentive sheet. (due Monday and turned in Tuesday)
- Grade lowered by 10% if turned in 2 days late. (due Monday and turned in Wednesday)
- If not turned by Wednesday of the week it is due, a grade of 50% will be entered into the grade book.

Illness:

- For each day the student is absent they have one extra day to turn in homework.
- Teachers, parents, and the student will work out timetables for completion in cases of longer absences.

Required signatures:

- Failure to get required signatures on tests, in assignment book, or on other forms does not impact a student's letter grade.
- Students receive a consequence point on the Friday Incentive Sheet for each day a signature is late.

Spelling

- The weekly spelling program is graded with a rubric independent of the daily written homework policy.
