Few! We made it through the first full week of school. Here's what we learned:

1st Grade

First graders learned how to say *me llamo* (my name is). We listened to a song entitled "Yo me llamo," which we will be learning how to sing to help us memorize the phrase *me llamo*. Rosco (my pet wolf puppet) also came out for a visit and asked the children *¿Cómo te llamas?* (What's your name?) in Spanish.

2nd Grade

Second graders started learning how to say the alphabet in Spanish. We've got a catchy marching song that's helping us remember the sounds the letters make in Spanish. So far we've only made it through K, but we'll be adding more next week!

3rd Grade

Third graders are reviewing how to say the letters in Spanish. Our alphabet unit will culminate in a Spanish spelling bee at the end of September.

4th Grade

Fourth graders reviewed the sounds that the letters say in Spanish and started learning the stress rules. There are four rules that govern where the stress, or accent, goes on Spanish words. Once the fourth graders have mastered those four rules, they will be able to pronounce any word they come across in Spanish, even if they've never seen it before.
