

DRESS CODE FOR 8TH GRADE FORTNIGHTLY

- Girls-Required:** Short or long dress or skirt with a blouse. Spaghetti strap tops or dresses must be worn with a sweater or wrap. Also required are hose, white gloves and dress shoes.
- Girls-Not Acceptable** Strapless or low cut necklines, backless or mini dresses, skin tight dresses, skirts with high slits, jean skirts or shorts. No bare skin at the midsection. No undergarments showing. High heels and platforms are discouraged. Backless shoes and gym shoes are not allowed.
- Boys-Required:** Dress slacks, dress shirt, tie, dress shoes. Sport coat is optional.
- Boys-Not Acceptable:** Jeans, sweatpants, shorts, t-shirts, gym shoes. No undergarments can be showing.
- Note:** **The guidelines are based on the Dress Code Policy and can be found in the Pleasantdale School District 107 Handbook.**

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

It is our expectation that any student attending PTA events either on/off school property:

- Respect the rights of others and treat others in a dignified manner
- Respect personal and public property
- Exhibit respect, courtesy and good manners with peers and adults.

Chaperones at PTA events will initiate the following actions when expectations are not met:

- Clarify rules and expectations in a quiet, non-confrontational manner
- Provide appropriate warning
- Employ time out as necessary
- Document infractions and interventions
- Notify the PTA Executive Committee

The Pleasantdale PTA Executive Committee will:

- Consult with the Pleasantdale administrative staff
- Notify parents or guardian of recurrent incidents and consequences
- Document actions taken

Behaviors subject to immediate disciplinary actions by the Pleasantdale PTA Executive Committee include:

- Inappropriate language
- Harassment (sexual, racial, ethnic, religious)
- Physical aggression
- Gross insubordination to supervising adults
- Weapons, tobacco, illegal substances on the person

The Pleasantdale PTA Executive Committee retains the right to remove or prohibit a student from attending a PTA event if the student continues to engage in inappropriate behavior or violates the behavior and/or dress code expectations.
